

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Feb. 25, 1982

Present were Sel. Todd, Sel. Olson and Sel. Mansfield. Secretary also present.

Mr. Papp came in to inquire about the possibility of building an apartment house on his property located on New Boston Road located near the Tracking Station. He claims the Tracking Station personnel is much in need of rentals. Sel. Olson advised him to wait until after town meeting when an Article will be voted on opting whether to adopt an amendment to the existing Ordinance which would allow multiple housing. He was also advised of the new Fire Code. He accepted this advise and will wait for the outcome of the vote on this article.

Margit Hooper approached the Selectmen regarding the Fire Dept. Auxiliary's desire to sponsor a yard sale on the Town Common on May 15. She was advised that they could invite New Boston residents to operate a table with the Auxiliary, but no non-residents, and that they are not to charge a fee for space, due to the involvement with insurance. She thanked the Selectmen and promised to abide by these rules.

David Poole, Jr. came in for permission for the Fire Dept. to operate a display table at the town hall during Town Election to conduct a membership drive, etc. Permission granted. Also there was the problem of David's name appearing on the ballot as running for Fire Ward without the "Jr." added. The Town Clerk resolved this oversight the next morning by returning the ballots to the Cabinet Press and inserting the omission.

Sandy Gallup came in with Joan Silvernail, correspondent for the Goffstown News. Sel. Mansfield had shown some concern regarding a picture sent in to the Goffstown News by Mrs. Silvernail with two men shoveling off the roof of the ~~food~~ stand, with the caption identifying the shovelers as (owned by the Playground Assoc.)

"New Boston Maintenance Crew" . Sel. Mansfield worried that some citizens might interpret this as that the New Boston road crew were ^{AS}~~were~~ shoveling a building which was not a town building, since it actually belongs to the Playground Asso. The shovelers were just some good samaritans doing their civic duty. Mrs. Silvernail will amend this error in a future issue of the paper.

Sandy Gallup also asked her to print a write-up on the activities of the Recreation Commission. There has been some confusion with the public as to the difference between the Recreation Commission and the Playground Association.
