

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

March 11, 1982

Present were Sel. Olson, Sel. Mansfield, Sel. (Newly elected) Caldwell and secretary.

The Selectmen met at 7:00 pm with Library Trustees Carolyn Todd, G.L. and Town Counsel, David L. Nixon, Esq. Wheeler, Dr. Samuel Brooks and Linda Rollins. The purpose of the meeting was to come to an agreement as to what projects remained unfinished on the library addition and to form a "punch list" to present to Mr. Eckman for completion so that the building will be ready for the stamp of approval of the Selectmen and Library Trustees. At this time, and not before, will he receive the balance of his bill. A meeting will be ~~xx~~ scheduled for the fourth week (the day which is agreeable to all) in March with the Library Trustees, Selectmen, Contractor Eckman ~~xxx~~, Architect, Michael Ingram. and Town Counsel, David L. Nixon, Esq.

Mr. Nixon advised the Trustees to prepare a punch list of all matters unfinished or unsatisfactory with the addition regardless of seeming insignificance and mail a copy to Mr. Eckman and Mr. Ingram. Mr. Nixon will receive a copy. The Fire Protection list was discussed and Mr. Nixon suggested getting the necessary information from the Fire Chief. It was agreed upon that the cost of the Fire Protection System will be an added cost to the building being as it was not included in the original specifications.

Following further discussion, it was agreed to pay Mr. Eckman his bill of February and pay one-half of the balance of Mr. Ingram's bill.

The meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm

Sel. Mansfield nominated Sel. Theodore Olson to act as chairman of the Board for 1982. The nomination was seconded by Sel. Caldwell and the motion carried.

James Huett came in complain that h^{is} well is contaminated by salt from the road. He explained that Mrs. Huett is on a no-salt diet and therefore is a health problem. He asked what recourse he had available. He was informed that this problem had never been brought before the Borad of Selectmen and they do not know what legal action is open, if any. Mr. Huett said he did notice that the salt level was lower when salting of roads ended for the winter season.

The Selectmen agreed to look further into the matter and will get back to him when they find out anything.
