

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

September 2, 1982

Three Selectmen and secretary present.

At 7:15 Robert Bose, Jr. presented a building permit for approval.

At 7:45 a Trailer Hearing was held at the request of Mr. & Mrs. Raymond Mrosewski to place a trailer on their property located on Weare Rd. on a temporary basis while building a house on the same property. The only ones present were Mr. & Mrs. Mrosewski. The Selectmen weighed all remarks and approved the application.

at 8:00 pm the Selectmen met with the Town Hall Committee at the Selectmen's request. Members ~~present~~ present were Howard Towne, James Dane, Joanne Luneau and Betsy Moore. A lengthy discussion ensued. The main question seemed to be whether to allow individuals to rent for private parties. The sentiment was that there was no objection to the hall being rented but rather how it is used and abused. It was agreed that the aerobic classes may continue. There was some doubt as to whether to allow the Recreation Commission to run the "haunted house" in October due to the condition of the hall in which it was left in the past years. It was a mutual agreement to schedule a meeting in the near future jointly with the School Board, Selectmen, School Principal and the Town Hall Committee to draw up some definite guide-lines and to try to solve the problem involving the school and town hall custodians pertaining to their duties for clean-up.

Betsy Moore reminded everyone that a railing at the back door of the hall is yet to be installed. Mr. Towne promised immediate attention.

William Mulligan, Library Trustee, reported his findings regarding insurance for library exhibits. Carrying "all risk" with \$100 deductible which also includes breakage, with \$5,000 coverage, the cost would be \$37 per year.

The new floor on the upper town hall is now completed. The Selectmen went over to inspect the project and found it most satisfactory and ~~xxx~~ placed their seal of approval. Final payment was made.

The Selectmen discussed with Police Chief Ballou and Fire Chief Dodge the request for a permit to hold an outing at the 4-H Grounds sponsored jointly by the N. H. Federated Sportsmen's Club and the N. H. Fish & Game Dept. It was unanimously felt that this was too great an undertaking for this small town with such a small police force. They all felt they should get more input into the plans and the amount of people expected to attend. A phone call was made to Mr. Levesque, the liason person, and a meeting was scheduled for Wednesday P. M. September 8 at the Town Office.

A Pistol Renewal permit was issued to Walter Houghton.

Building Permits were approved for the following: Robert Bose, Jr., Russell Gomes and George McGondel, Jr.
