

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

October 21, 1982

Three Selectmen and secretary present.

Helen Normandin came in to ask rules for a home business. She was advised that her plans will be acceptable without special permit.

George Hawkins came in with Mr. Jamison from the State Prison to discuss the possibility of installing street signs throughout New Boston. Mr. Jamison displayed sample signs and price lists. The Selectmen will consider the issue. Mr. Jamison also added that his department operates an auto repair shop and furniture refinishing shop available for Municipalities.

Mr. David Hayden, Federal Civil Defense official, and Police Chief John Ballou, New Boston Civil Defense officer, came in with Federal government forms to be signed by the Selectmen. The Selectmen asked him the general feeling of the public regarding Civil Defense. He explained that the public is of the opinion that there would be no defense in the event of nucleus bombing, that there would be no survivors. The Department feels their readiness at this point is more for natural disasters.

The Quitclaim Deed and agreement regarding the Weadick vs. Town of New Boston was signed by the Selectmen to be recorded. The Town will now receive \$150 dollars per month from Jay Marden until full payment is received.
