<u>A. DEBRIS CLEARANCE</u>	<u>B. PROTECTIVE MEASURES</u>	<u>C. ROAD SYSTEM</u>
Clearance of trees and woody debris; building wreckage, sand, mud, silt, and gravel; vehicles; and other disaster-related material deposited on public property.	Measures taken before, during, and after a disaster to save lives, protect public health and safety, and protect improved public and private property. Some examples: Warning devices (barricades, signs and announcements) Search & Rescue Security Forces (police and guards) Sandbagging Bracing/shoring damaged structures Emergency repairs to roads and infrastructure EOC Activation Traffic Control/Evacuation measures Snowplowing	Repair of roads, bridges, and associated features, such as: Roads: Shoulders, ditches, culverts, lighting and signs Bridges: Repairs to decking, guardrails, girders, pavement, abutments, piers, slope protection and approaches. (Excludes bridges on Federal Aid roads.)
<u>D. WATER CONTROL FACILITIES</u>	<u>E. BUILDINGS and EQUIPMENT</u>	<u>E. PUBLIC UTILITY SYSTEMS</u>
Repair of irrigation systems, drainage channels, and pumping facilities. Repair of levees, dams, and flood control channels fall under this Category, however, eligibility of these facilities is restricted.	Repair or replacement of buildings, including their content and systems; heavy equipment; and vehicles.	Repair of water treatment and delivery systems; power generation facilities and distribution lines (generators, substations); and sewage collection and treatment facilities.
