

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

June 7, 1979

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

Walter Dickerman submitted a building permit to build a house on a 1+ acre lot which was subdivided prior to the town Ordinance.

Mr. & Mrs. Quirk, new owners of the Friendly Beaver Campground, came in to inquire what should be done to have the road through the campground accepted by the town reclassifying it to Class V so the town would be responsible for plowing. At their convenience, the Selectmen will inspect the road to determine what work needs to be done before placing an article in the March Town Warrant to be voted upon. Mr. Quirk also asked about owning his own trailers placed in the campground for rental. Tom said the ordinance does not cover this situation, but the Selectmen will look into it.

Warren Moss came in to complain that the L<sup>U</sup>vejoys are dredging their property across from him and running the water onto his property via an existing culvert. Merrill thought this permissible since he felt the water was only returning by its natural flow from the cellar hole to the culvert. Mr. Moss reported a test of his well showed a high level of coliform, higher than acceptable. His question was, is this what he will be expected to put up with. The two Selectmen felt they were not qualified to make judgment, but will wait to see if Mr. Sallada has found out anything to make a decision.

Andy Gallagher and Sandy Fletcher returned to ask for an extension to their permit to include the next day for sleeping overnight and cleanup purposes. They were advised that the permit allowed this, but only through Sunday.

Milton Elliott brought in a report of gravel removal. He said he had opened a new State-approved access for safer entry onto Rte. 13.
