

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

September 20, 1979

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

Mrs. Frank Severance came in asking for an extension to remain in the campground until October 28. Her reasons being that there is no water on their home site as yet. Tom promised a decision on the matter when the full Board could meet. She advised that the Dion family is still at the campground.

Paul Buchanan submitted application to hold another outdoor festival on his property on October 6. The Selectmen asked him to come back next Thursday at 9:00 pm and they would have a definite answer to his request.

George O. St. John came in at the request of the Selectmen to discuss quality of new keys and locks for the Town Hall. He extended samples. He estimated the locks and keys recommended would cost \$415. He was asked to submit a new proposal.

William Elliott brought in his driveway permit from the State reinstating an application of a year ago, which the State considered out-dated. He was then granted his building permit.

James Dodge was asked to meet with the Road Agent and the Selectmen on Thursday Sept. 27 at 7:30 pm in regard to the paving of the driveway of the fire station. Mr. Dodge was also granted permission to increase the amount of his acreage under Current Use.

The Selectmen signed two trapping permits for George Peirce.

Building Permits were granted to William Elliott and James Dane.

Driveway Permits were granted for 4 subdivision of the Edith Hooper plan and two for the Zwillinger plan. Also one permit for Richard Warnock.

Nancy Strong, Canine Control Officer, announced the following new rates: \$3.00 for daily feed and care for the required 7 days;

\$5.00 to pick up a dog and deliver it to the Animal Rescue League 7 days following.

The members of the Conservation Commission met with the Selectmen to determine what could be possibly be done in regard to the Milton Elliott problem of his attitude of ignoring the request of the Selectmen to clean up junk cars. Dave Woodbury suggested taking him to court with David L. Nixon presenting the evidence. Also in regard to Mr. Elliott's violation of the Dredge & Fill laws, the Selectmen will write to the Water Pollution Control Board asking for an up-date on the situation with a copy <sup>of the reply</sup> to be sent to the Conservation Commission.k
