

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

October 18, 1979

Present were Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

Mrs. Kenneth Malandrino came in to ask for an extension to her building permit application which by law expires after one year. She was granted a 60-day extension.

George St. John asked the Selectmen to sign permits granting him the privilege of trapping on the Siemeze lot and the Lydia Dodge lot. The Selectmen also signed for him the authorization to purchase 24 keys for new Town Hall locks.

Dennis Hooper came in to complain about the condition of the culverts around town, especially on Meetinghouse Hill. He claimed he had inspected the culverts and they were badly in need of cleaning out. He added that the gutters on the sides of the road were filled in forcing the water to drain down the road rather than to the sides. Richard Moody also came in to complain about the condition of the dirt roads. The Selectmen will speak to the Road Agent.

Building permits were approved for Roger Binette - barn; George White - porch.

The following appointments were made: Paul Stanger - Library Trustee or replace Mary Bunting Smith - term to expire March 1980; Dan Halpin - alternate to the Planning Board for a one year term.

Beatrice Kanzer reported someone defaced the Davis Memorial on River Road. Beth Kanzer removed debris.

Due to the poor condition of the Town Hall following a private party reserved by the Robert Riley family, \$15 was withheld from their security deposit .

The Selectmen voted to permit the Union Leader correspondent to read the minutes of the Selectmen's meetings, for publication of anything that might be considered of interest to the public. A separate book will be kept for Executive Sessions.

The full board of Selectmen will attend a meeting on November 1 sponsored by the South Western Regional Planning Commission, pertaining to roads. The Selectmen's Meeting for that night will be cancelled.
