

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

October 25, 1979

Present were Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

George St. John brought in the keys for the new Town Hall locks. There are 24 keys, which are numbered, and he retained key #24, to be returned later.

Mr. Quirk, owner of Friendly Beaver Campground, came in at the request of the Selectmen to discuss residency of the tenants at his campground. It had been rumored, and complaints were made to the Selectmen, that there were people living at the campground, which is contrary to the town ordinance. One occupant registered a car in New Boston and paid Resident tax here, giving the campground as ^{his} their permanent address.

Mr. Quirk declared himself innocent to accepting anyone as a ^{Resident} permanent, and explained that he asks each renter to sign in, giving his permanent address. Mr. Mansfield advised him that he must allow only campers in

his park. He was informed about the 45-day law permitting campers and trailers to be located in one spot without moving. If the trailer remains over this period of time, it is subject to being taxed, with the owner of the land bearing responsibility of the tax in the event the owner of the trailer does not pay. He agreed to abide by the Town Ordinance.

The Selectmen met with the Trustees of the Library to discuss the possibility of placing an article in the Warrant at Town Meeting requesting funds for an addition to the Library building.

A building permit was approved for an ~~extension~~ addition to the building owned by Plastic Techniques, Inc. located on Route 13.
