

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Mar. 5, 1982

Present were Sel. Merrill Todd, Sel. Ted Olson, Sel. ~~Thomas~~ Thomas Mansfield and Sec. Betty Hooper.

The Selectmen met at 7:00 with a salesman from Calcuim-Mite Co. and Road Agent, Almus Chancey, to decide which chemical to purchase for use on the roads for dust control. Sel. Olson asked that the Selectmen receive a chemical analysis on this product. Request will be granted. The salesman recommended that the chemical be spread on the roads twice a year - spring and fall. He quoted the price of \$12.95 per gallon. The chemical is to be diluted 6 to 1 bringing the price about \$2.00 per gallon. It is sold in 55-gallon drums. It was estimated that 6 diluted gallons should cover about one mile. If a contract is signed, the company will donate a "parts washer" as a company promotion. The Road Agent will also purchase the solvent used in the "parts washer".from this company. In addition, the company will give 3 or 4 hand pumps for the drums. The salesman was asked if the calcium was caustic. He replied that if splashed on the skin, it would do no harm. The only precaution is not to let the chemical freeze.

Robert Tremblay came in to ask permission to install a sign on his garage to advertize auto repairs. The Selectmen discussed whether he should have to apply for a home business permit. They have no objections to the sign as long as it is in his name as the home owner. They will consider the home business situation and get back to him with their decision.

Pistol permits were issued to Dale Swisher and David Bowen.
