

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

May 20, 1982

Three Selectmen and secretary present.

The Selectmen met at 7:30 pm with Pastor Maxwell & Charles ~~Stanford~~ Sandford from the church of The Kingdom at the request of the Selectmen to forward a report of Financial Status required on the initial filing requesting tax-exemption for non-profit organization. Mr. Sandford lightly touched upon the handling of funds by the organization, but was not completely knowledgeable as to what the Selectmen needed for proof. Sel. Olson suggested he call the State Attorney General for assistance. Mr. Olson agreed that whatever report satisfied the State would satisfy the Selectmen. They would like copies of the reports which The Kingdom sends to the State. Mr. Sandford offered that the Kingdom already gets the exemption for their properties in Dublin and Amherst. The Headquarters are located in Dublin and they support ten other churches in other States. Pastor Maxwell explained that the reason they have now approached New Boston is that one of their members, Mr. Anderson, is a Selectmen in Amherst and being familiar with the rules, he felt they would qualify.

Mr. Frederick Green came in to protest that he was not given the Current Use reduction on land he bought from Mr. Kaufman. The Selectmen apologized for the error and will submit a refund.

Mr. Lee Beers submitted an "Intent to cut Lumber".

William Sears came in to check Tax Maps. The Selectmen asked him if he would be interested in taking over the work of finishing the Tax Maps. Mr. August Gomes is not progressing much and the work is lagging badly. He said he would be glad to help, but suggested the Selectmen confer with Mr. Gomes first, as he would not like to have bad feelings. They said they would do this and get back to him.
