

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

August 12, 1982

Three Selectmen and secretary present.

Michael LaMarche came in for advise on his building permit.

Shirley L Sullivan came in to discuss once more the matter of ~~Lynette~~ ~~Tantkus~~ the purchase of the Merrill garage by Mr. Charles French to operate a woodworking business with himself being the only employee. The Selectmen will write a letter of approval.

Gloria Riley came in asking for financial assistance. The Selectmen offered to help with rent and electric bill. She will come in next month to report on her financial situation, if there has been any changes.

Mr. George Owens came in to inquire about the purchase of the 2 Town Lots at Riverside Drive. He has offered the Selectmen \$8,000 as maximum. The Selectmen will confer with the Road Agent as to the latest cost for preparing Riverside Drive for acceptance by the town. The agreement had been that the lots would sell ~~xx~~ for whatever the cost of the road would be. Since at this time the cost of the road has increased beyond the value of the lots, the Selectmen plan to place an article in the Town Warrant of 1983 asking for the balance of the cost of the road. Mr. Owens offered to put a deposit of \$400 on the lots at this time.

Gerald Speck came in to report on the progress of his new house.

Mr. Mrosewski applied for a permit to place a trailer on his property on Weare Road while buying his new house. A Hearing will be scheduled.

Victor Daniels came to discuss the sale of his 6 acres ~~lot~~ purchased for the School Department. The Selectmen promised payment in full Sept. 9. Mr. Daniels wanted it understood that after he receives his money and he has turned over the deed to the property, all further expenses will be incurred by the town. The Selectmen agreed.

Members of the Fish & Game Club dropped by to discuss a letter of objection to the proposed location of their Rifle Range from Atty. David Nixon. He was adamant enough in his objections to threaten to resign as Town Counsel if the proposed location was accepted. Sel. Mansfield suggested, because of his strong objections, the Club should scrap this area. The majority feels they should approach Mr. Nixon with details of their plans before continuing with any plans.

A building permit was approved for Mr. & Mrs. Graham Pendlebury. The meeting was adjourned at midnight.
