

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

August 26, 1982

Three Selectmen and secretary present.

Members of the Fish & Game Club reported having met with David Nixon regarding the use of the Lydia Dodge land for a shooting range and, due to his strong objection to the added traffic on Old Coach Road, the Club decided to scrap the whole idea. They will locate elsewhere.

Clovis Gentlehomme came in to report on the progress on the Town Hall floor. He has asked for an extension of time of completion. The markings for basketball were discussed as to who would replace the lines. Mr. Gentlehomme inquired cost of the job by a professional and was quoted \$1,000. He offered to do the job for \$300. The Selectmen left it in his hands.

Mr. Santo Myers came in to complain about activities at the Magoon residence. He reports they are installing a septic system to their garage which has been converted to a dwelling which is in violation to the town ordinance prohibiting two dwellings on one lot. The Selectmen will look into the matter.

Dr. Brooks came in to discuss various subjects regarding the library. It was agreed that the town will pay for the purchase of a librarian desk and be refunded by the Library Trustees, from the Hayes furniture fund. Dr. Brooks mentioned that the front doors are not the ones ordered and the Trustees want them removed with the proper ones installed. The Selectmen feel that weather-stripping should suffice. Next was mentioned was the rug running to the front of the Librarian's desk. The Trustees feel it is not in a proper ~~pxi~~ position. The Selectmen decided it shall remain as is.

The Trustees now want a rider to their insurance to cover exhibits which they planned to display in the library. Sel. Olson suggested they call Gordon Burns Agency to find out if such coverage all ready exists.

The River Road Spring water was discussed. The water has been tested and reported a great improvement but still some contamination. Dr. Brooks suggested better over-hanging covers for insurance against debris.

Building permits were approved for the following: Douglas Barnett, William Fernald, Michael Cullinan and Michael LaMarche.

A pistol permit renewal was issued to George Strong.
