

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

November 18, 1982

Three Selectmen and secretary present. The Selectmen held Executive Session ~~xxxxx~~ prior to seeing the public.

The case of Hall Brothers illegal cement foundation on a lot of land on Route 136 was discussed. There is question whether this matter should have gone to the Board of Adjustment or not. Sel. Olson will meet with town Counsel to help make a proper decision.

Sel. Mansfield reported that Robert Kennedy is still looking to buy the 'salt-shed' land, and also Scott has expressed a desire to rent the building located on River Road which served as the original town shed. Sel. Olson reported there is a problem with the two campgrounds located on Old Coach Road. The Postal Department requested that occupants of Friendly Beaver Campground relocate mailboxes closer to the road., In doing this, the boxes obstruct from view a sign reading "Wildwood Campground" ~~xxx~~ which was erected by Mr. George St. John. Mr. St. John strongly objects to this procedure and flatly refuses to relocate his sign. It was the decision of the Selectmen to remain neutral in this matter being that the complaints rest between Mr. St. John and the Postal Dept. Mr. St. John claims that he received permission from the Selectmen to place his sign on this town property. The Selectmen concede that permission was probably granted, but with no specific spot mentioned.

The resignation of Dr. Samuel Brooks was accepted with regret from his appointment on the Planning Board. A new member will be appointed.

The Board of Adjustment has requested the appointment of an additional Alternate member to ~~the~~ its Board.

Sel. Olson reported he has dug another spot to supply water to the River Road Spring. He has sent a sample from the new area for testing. If this proves acceptable, the Spring will be re-opened.

At 8:00 pm, the Selectmen met with Mr. & Mrs. Sidney Magoon to discuss the matter of their having two dwellings on their land. The Selectmen have received many complaints from the Magoon's neighbor, Mr. Myre related to a combined water supply to the Magoon and Myre homes. To cover the law, the Selectmen suggested that the Magoons erect a car-port to span both dwellings. The Magoons decided to discuss the entire matter this week and come back to the next Selectmen's Meeting with their decision.

The following property owners came to question the assessment on their property: Mr. & Mrs. Frederic Cutting, Mr. Charles Carlson and Mr. Richard Turosh. Also Mr. Melvin Dashwsky, owner of a travel trailer situated at the Friendly Beaver Campground, reported he registers the trailer and that the trailer is constantly used for trips throughout the year and therefore is never left at length at the campground. The Selectmen approved an abatement.

Robert Kennedy came in to discuss the town property which abutts his land on Molly Stark Lane. The Selectmen will schedule a Public Auction for December 9 for the sale of this property and the old town shed property.
