

Selectmen's Meeting December 5, 1988

Present were Selectmen Mansfield, Dodge and secretary.

- 7:00 James Hawkins a member of the Conservation Committee came in to review the Siemeze and Follansbee land which is town property to consider this land for recreational purposes.
- 7:15 Selectmen met with Administrator Assistant to discuss traveling expenses for the office girls to attend a two day computer class. Expenses would be covered.
- 7:30 Selectmen signed weekly checks and reviewed weekly mail.
- 8:05 Robert Todd's gravel hearing was held with no abutters attending. Letters notifying the abutters were sent to Herbert Elliott, Roy Follansbee, Gardner Lebaron, Laban Todd, and Robert Todd Jr. Estimated quantity of material to be removed each year for approximately 4 or 5 years would be 50,000 yards. Mr. Todd would like to contract this operation with one contractor. They would probably be using 10-wheeler dump and trailer dump trucks. The travel route will be out Middle Branch Road to Route 136. The hours of operation will be 7am-5pm Monday - Friday and Sat. 8am - 12noon for local hauling. Selectmen Mansfield read the letter from the Conservation Committee regarding their inspection. Robert Todd felt that most of the property consist of good quality sand. He is planning to have a contractor start at the top instead of removing sand from the side of the banking this will prevent any possible run off. Mr. Todd would be willing to work around the school busing hours.
