

Officer Watson,

This letter is to formally recognize you for your investigative efforts on the morning of March 9, 2013 related to State v. Merchant.

On March 9, 2013 at 0235 hours, you were dispatched to Sizemore's Auto Repair, located on Weare Road, for an alarm activation. Upon arriving on scene, you located a suspect vehicle with two occupants inside.

Through your investigative effort, you were able to determine that the passenger was a juvenile from New Boston who had been lured, online, into meeting with the operator. You also determined that the operator was a 46 year old registered sex offender who resided in the City of Concord.

You subsequently arrested the operator for a motor vehicle violation which furthered the investigation into his unlawful activities. You also provided protection to the victim which promoted a safe return to their family.

On May 14, 2013, following a trial in the 9th Circuit Court – Goffstown Division, the suspect was Found Guilty of your arresting offense.


