I finally tracked down the info on the ownership of the road.

Turns out the data is now held by Fish and Game as it is an access to public waters.

The road is still owned by the State but overseen by F&G. It is still a class 5 road as per the RSA that enables it. This apparently cannot be changed even if the road is not maintained for a period of time.

I spoke with Elizabeth McNaughten at F&G, and she said she would be willing to attend any ^LPanning board or Selectmen's meeting if necessary to straighten out issues. [^]
