## New Hampshire Current Use Tax Rules

Rural landowners of 10+ acres can enroll their property in the state "CURRENT USE" program, and lower their property taxes. However, this protected property also has restrictions on its future use. Also, remember that a detailed *written management plan* is now required for forestland enrolled in the "Stewardship" category.

This workshop is sponsored and conducted by UNH Cooperative Extension and the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands. We will be there to explain Current Use assessment and the different aspects of the program so you can decide if this land conservation opportunity is right for you. If your land is already in Current Use, this will be a good refresher course to remind you of the regulations.
