

Lyndebo Road Conservation Area

This 41.98 acres along the Piscataquog River was acquired by the Town of New Boston through the Land Conservation Investment program. It was purchased from Charles and Frances Towne. The pristine property is managed for low-impact riverfront recreational uses.

Natural footpaths follow the slow moving river that is used for fishing and other recreational activities.

While enjoying the area look for: otter slides, beaver activity, the granite bridge abutment sitting on submerged logs, water fowl including ducks and blue heron and a variety of soft and hard woods. There is also a spectacular glacial esker rising next to the river on the westerly part of the property.
