- A. Call to Order, approve meeting minutes for April 20, 2022 edited minutes approved unanimously

- C. Old Business
  - White Building Windows
    - o 2 bids have been received
      - Morin Construction \$40, 400 +\$1,380 (extra fee for flexible scheduling)
      - Valken \$38,452 (no extra charge for flexible scheduling)
    - Roger Dignard reviewed both bids. Willing to oversee the process for the department. The commissioners would like to express their appreciation to Roger for his time, support, and expertise in this project.
    - Mike asked about working around existing programs in August (Lego Camp and Driver's Ed). Both are willing to work around the programs; however, Morin would add extra staffing fees for the flexible scheduling.
    - Will need to order this week (8-week lead time) for August installation
