This project addresses the urgent need in the Town of New Boston for a fire station that is up to code and capable of addressing the needs of the Town and the New Boston Space Force Station and assisting neighboring towns as requested.

The proposed action alternative consists of construction of a fire station that would be located primarily on tax parcel Map 8 Lot 110-2 on Mont Vernon Road in New Boston, Hillsborough County, New Hampshire. This parcel encompasses approximately 3.25 acres of cleared vacant land with trees along the edges and is at an elevation of approximately 433 ft. The parcel was purchased by the Town of New Boston on June 5, 2015. The No Action alternative would maintain the status quo as a new facility would not be constructed.
