

## Camp Week at a Glance

Below is an outline of what summer camp will be like day to day for campers. We plan to adjust this with camper feedback in the first couple weeks. A couple things to note:

Field trips will be scheduled on Tuesdays and other 'in-house' activities may fall on different days from week to week.

Daily activity choices will vary day to day with camper input. Each block will have at least 3 choices of activities for campers to choose from or a camp-wide activity will be offered. Campers will be encouraged to try activities in different areas, but ultimately can choose whichever activity is of most interest to them.

Fridays will be our day to visit Mill Pond (weather permitting) so please pack a bathing suit and towel as well as shoes for getting wet. Visiting Dodge's General Store will be an option on Friday afternoons (purchases from Dodge's should not replace a camper's lunch). If you plan to have your child visit Dodge's, please send them with \$2-\$5 in cash. We also plan to focus on an act of kindness each Friday as well.

This outline provides families a snapshot of how a typical day at camp will be formatted:

Examples of opportunities in each activity area may include but are not limited to:

Nature-fairy house building, walks (choose a trail to explore), scavenger hunts, fort building work, and walks to the library

Games/Building-Legos, cards, board games, science, building. \*Typically inside

Arts/Crafts- beading, friendship bracelets, markers/crayons/pens/painting, perler beads, clay, weekly theme related crafts, etc. \*typically inside

Sports-dodgeball, baseball/softball, basketball, soccer, gaga ball, wall ball, Frisbee, capture the flag, flag football etc.
